Organization in Focus: Turning the Page

Turning the Page reached out to JPNA about their organization to talk at one of our meetings.

Turning the Page's mission is to link public schools, families and our community so that, together, we can ensure students receive valuable educational resources and a high-quality public education.

Programs include Community Nights, Author Visits, and Summer Learning Events, as well as Parent Leadership programming, teacher professional development and book distributions for families' home libraries. Programs build on each other to support school communities and parents leaders becoming skilled and confident in their abilities to improve education through ongoing family engagement.

COMMUNITY NIGHTS - Turning the Page Community Nights, eight of which are held at each partner school per year, consist of educational parent workshops, literacy-based child mentoring activities, book giveaways for families' home libraries, and a free, healthy family dinner.

AUTHOR VISITS - Since 2001, more than 75 author and illustrator volunteers have visited 150 Community Nights! Visiting authors read one of their stories to families and answer student questions. Classrooms of students will have discussed the author's book beforehand and often prepare a special welcome for the visiting author.

"Lock your car, house, garage doors and windows, all the time, every time.


