Sgt. Alvarez Says,

LOCK YOUR WINDOWS AND DOORS ON YOUR HOUSE, CAR, GARAGE,

ALL THE TIME, EVERY TIME

With the weather warming up, more citizens are out riding their bicycles. This is a good time to review bicycle safety. Reduce your chance of a serious head injury by wearing a properly fitted bicycle helmet. The majority of bicyclists who die in motor vehicle crashes were not wearing bike helmets. When riding, go with the traffic flow and obey all traffic laws. It's really important to make sure you and your bike are visible to drivers. Increase your visibility to drivers by wearing reflective cycling clothing and accessories. Invest in a front and back light combo, preferably with a flashing rear light for additional safety.

As children are out walking this summer, it's also important to remind them to walk in pairs and avoid walking in alleys and playing inside vacant houses. Remind children to never accept a ride from a stranger and never get into a stranger's car. Tell your child to say NO! LOUD and CLEAR! Please practice your safety tips and have a safe summer!

Safety Tip(s)

Remove the release cord from your Garage overhead door. Thieves break into overhead doors by drilling hole and use a wire to catch the overhead cord release.

When walking or biking at night wear a bright color.

Store for under \$5.

When staying at a hotel use a rubber door stop (under \$5) to prevent unwanted access when you are in the room.

There is a proposal of a 16-story building at the northeast corner of Lipps and Ainslie. The construction of such a tall and dense building would set a precedent, not only for Jefferson Park but, also, for the entire northwest side. It would create much additional traffic, parking issues and further overcrowding at the local schools, already between 130% - 160% capacity. These are all concerns important to the local community.

Despite community opposition, in the form of a petition with 1,000 signatures against this building, Alderman Arena still chooses to move forward with this project. Ron Ernst, a JPNA board member, has filed a lawsuit, on his own behalf, to prevent this construction. He has raised a sizeable amount of money through fundraisers and donations using the 'go fund me' page. But, any additional help would be appreciated.

UPDATE ABOUT 5150 N. NORTHWEST HIGHWAY!!

About a year ago, 6,500 signatures were collected opposing this 7-story building plan. At that time, an agreement was in force limiting construction height to 4 stories. This came from the Gladstone Park Commercial Corridor Study, written by a senior member of the Chicago City Dept. of Planning. It was then endorsed by the Gladstone Park Chamber of Commerce and the Gladstone Park Neighborhood Association. The Jefferson Park Chamber of Commerce added their endorsement for the area south of Foster and the Expressway. YET, Alderman Arena was and is intent on going forward with this plan.

The developer needed \$26 million in low income housing tax credits to be approved by the Illinois Housing Development Authority for this venture to go forth. But, the IHDA has decided NOT to award these **needed tax** credits for this construction. And, the next time these tax credits can be requested for this project will be in March 2019. Please keep this in mind as the next aldermanic election will be held in **February 2019 and COME OUT AND VOTE!!**






