## On the teachers strike

There has been a long series over 10 years that have led up to the current teachers strike that recently occurred. Over this period, the CTU had to file and still has pending the fact that in hiring, it has practiced both age and race discrimination. It says it has no money and is in debt, but then spends millions of tax money on crazy computer programs that do not work and result in more than 3,000 grievances on payroll errors and giving money to charter schools which do not have all highly qualified teachers. Much of what has happened in the last 10 years are simply ways to return the school to being patronage jobs as they were in the 50's when scandal made CPS institute written civil service exams.

In his speech to the media, Mayor Rahm spoke an untruth or misinformation. He said the evaluation process of teachers had not changed in 40 years. They have changed 2 or 3 times with changes in different contracts. Each time the evaluation process was changed, it was changed in favor of Principals having a simpler process to follow, making it easier to give teachers a poorer rating and easier to fire them. Each of these changes during the 40 years made conditions worse for teachers. This current proposed process is the worst. One of the reasons for the strike is that the Mayor and CPS lawyers and administration cannot be trusted because of the way they state things which are in error as if they were true. Life for teachers in CPS is one of abuse like this one.
