In the last newsletter, JPNA published a letter that reviewed several restaurants along Milwaukee Avenue. While that is the first place we think of for food in Jefferson Park, do not let yourself forget that along several East/West avenues there are hidden gems.

Turn east at the corner of Montrose and you will find Pizza by Alex which has one of the best brick oven pizzas on the entire Northwest side. Add the salads and pasta for the vegetarian or dieter in the group for a winning combination. In the other direction at Central is Scoops which offers a wide range of fast, American fare from sandwiches to full meals.

Moving up to Lawrence Avenue, head west for Dough to Go (by the Pink Poodle) which is a coffee shop that has specialty baked goods. Just west of Central Ave. is Smakosz which has classic Polish foods along with homemade soups "to die for". Right on the corner of Central, the former Super Cup has taken a giant step forward in quality while maintaining cost effective pricing that allows frequent visits without breaking the budget. The Central Kitchen and Tap has slow cooked ribs, mix and match sides, salads and pastas that well serve the vegetarian diet and the hungry. And for the meat lover, both the roasted pork and the pot roast taste like home cooking – only a little better.

As spring turns into summer, it is great to have a varied list of local destinations for food that we can walk to for dinner or a leisurely lunch. Only by supporting our local merchants will we keep these choices available.

But this carries over to other areas, too.
